

TEMPORARY RESOLUTION NO. 100-12

PERMANENT RESOLUTION NO. 96-12

A RESOLUTION TO SUPPORT A REGIONAL WATER TANK STORAGE MAINTENANCE REQUEST FOR QUALIFICATION (RFQ) PROCESS

WHEREAS, the City of Pickerington, County of Fairfield, City of Lancaster, Village of Baltimore, and other surrounding entities, would like to coordinate a regional Request for Qualifications (RFQ) effort to competitively identify companies that could potentially provide each respective entity with affordable contracted water storage tank maintenance services; and

WHEREAS, collectively coordinating a competitive RFQ process will provide the opportunity for participating water storage tank maintenance companies to pursue the financial benefits associated with establishing regional water storage tank maintenance contracts with multiple public water utilities in Fairfield County; and

WHEREAS, all participating entities understand that their respective public water utilities would profit from a regional collaboration designed to give individual utilities the benefit of water tank maintenance services secured via a competitive regional selection process;

WHEREAS, all participating entities would each appoint one (1) representative to what could be referred to as the Regional Fairfield Water Tank Maintenance RFQ Selection Committee; and

WHEREAS, the Regional Fairfield Water Tank Maintenance RFQ Selection Committee would responsibly coordinate a Request for Qualifications effort to competitively attract water tank maintenance companies which could provide the City of Pickerington, County of Fairfield, City of Lancaster, Village of Baltimore, and all other participating entities with contracted water storage tank maintenance services;

BE IT RESOLVED BY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LANCASTER, OHIO

SECTION 1. Lancaster City Council hereby concurs with the recommendations of the Water/Water Pollution Control Committee and agrees to support this regional opportunity to provide the City of Pickerington, County of Fairfield, City of Lancaster, Village of Baltimore, and all participating entities, each with an experienced and qualified water storage tank maintenance company, that could pro-actively schedule the successful maintenance of individual water storage tank facilities at affordable and predictable annual costs for years to come.

SECTION 2. That the Mayor shall appoint a representative to the Regional Fairfield Water Tank Maintenance RFQ selection committee.

SECTION 3. That this resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
